Rooster — 1933, 1945, 1957, 1969, 1981, 1993, 2005 Roosters are good workers. They have lots of friends.




Dog — 1934, 1946, 1958, 1970, 1982, 1994, 2006 Dogs are faithful and friendly. They can keep a secret.




**Pig**— **1935, 1947, 1959, 1971, 1983, 1995, 2007** Pigs are honest, brave, and proud. They love to learn.
